Statement of Qualifications

In order to be considered for the Investigator position, you must complete and submit a Statement of Qualifications with your State application, form std. 678. The Statement of Qualifications on the following page of this bulletin must be completed and submitted with your application form to ensure consideration.

Duties

Under the supervision of the Supervising Lottery Agent, the Investigator's responsibilities include:

- Independently conduct complex and sensitive criminal, civil and administrative investigations into allegations of criminal activity by Lottery employees, retailers and/or contractors
- Investigate complaints and allegations of administrative misconduct of retailers, claimants, distributors, suppliers and contractors to the Lottery
- Conduct probation and parole searches, prepare and serve search warrants; make custodial arrests; issue citations; submit criminal complaints to local prosecutors
- Conduct interviews and seize physical evidence in accordance with POST guidelines
- Monitor the ticket printing process, maintain Security Division test lab, and review game working papers
- Conduct background investigations of Lottery employees and contractors

Desirable Qualifications

Applicants applying for this position should:

- Be proficient in computer systems and software
- Possess in-depth knowledge of investigative procedures and techniques and have an aptitude for evaluating information (including computer data)
- Have experience with conducting interviews and/or interrogations of suspects, witnesses and victims, and properly documenting investigations in writing (reports)
- Have experience in conducting investigations of robberies, burglaries, possession of stolen property crimes, stolen/forged checks, altered/forged documents, and similar Part-2 property crimes
- Possess a valid POST academy certification or a POST Basic Certificate
- Be willing to work overtime and travel at any time (including out-of-state, overnight, and national)

Who Should Apply

Applicants must be state employees who are currently in the Investigator classification, have transfer eligibility, or on a current eligible list for appointment to this classification. A Training and Development (T&D) assignment will be considered. Applications will be screened and only those that best meet the requirements of the job will be considered. Appointment is subject to the provisions of SROA/Surplus.
