Messages to the Public



Dear Californians:

When Governor Gray Davis appointed me as Director of the California Lottery®, he impressed upon me his conviction that the people of California need to know that the Lottery is financially sound and that its funds are supporting our schools, as required by law. That's what this report is designed to do.

As Governor Davis promised, the Lottery's financial information has been independently reviewed by the Department of Finance, Office

of State Audits and Evaluations who engaged KPMG LLP, a Big Five accounting firm, to assist them in analyzing certain aspects of the Lottery's administrative costs, sales efficiency and planning processes. Based on their review, the Department of Finance is satisfied that the Lottery's financial management has been appropriate and responsible in both its operations and planning. Moreover, as this report details, more than 34 cents of every Lottery dollar flows directly into California's schools.

In 1984, California voters approved a state Lottery whose proceeds, after paying expenses and awards, would go to public education. After 15 years of operation, it's a good time to look at what the Lottery has meant to our state.

Perhaps the best way to do this is to answer the question posed most often by skeptics and critics of the Lottery: Has the Lottery solved California's school funding problems?

The answer is "no". The Lottery was never intended to solve school funding problems. But all net proceeds from the Lottery, a minimum of 34 percent of Lottery revenue, go to public education. That amount is approaching \$1 billion a year—or about two percent of the total public education budget in California. Since its inception, the California Lottery® has provided more than \$12 billion for education—not an insignificant amount, but clearly the Lottery is not the panacea for school funding either.


Local schools still must depend on annual appropriations from the State for most of their operating funds and locally-approved bond measures that pay for buildings and other capital investments.

In this report, you will see how much the Lottery has provided to each public school district and to public colleges and universities in the state. Many school districts say they value the Lottery money because they have the discretion to use it to meet local priorities. The report provides examples of how some school districts are using their Lottery dollars.

In the past 15 years, the Lottery has contributed nearly \$32 billion to our state's economy. Lottery revenue goes into the California economy: to schools, to residents and to businesses. The retailers who sell the tickets have received nearly \$2 billion. More than \$522 million, or 35% of the Lottery's total procurement dollars, has gone to small businesses, the backbone of our state's economy. And \$16 billion has gone to the winners, including more than 1,600 Lottery millionaires.

The people at the California Lottery® will continue to carry out our mission of providing supplemental funds for public education. I pledge to you that the Lottery will do this responsibly and with integrity.

Attached, and in accordance with its Interagency Agreement with the California State Lottery® (Lottery), the Department of Finance, Office of State Audits and Evaluations presents its review concerning the Lottery.


We engaged KPMG LLP, the Big Five accounting firm that also annually audits the Lottery's financial statements, to assist us in examining key areas of the Lottery's operations. The analysis focused on whether the Lottery's administrative cost effectiveness, sales efficiency, and planning processes—issues identified in a 1996 audit of the lottery by the Bureau of State Audits—have improved. Lottery administrative costs were 15.5 percent of revenue in fiscal year 1996–97. As indicated in the report, the Lottery reduced that figure to 13.2 percent in 1999–2000 while at the same time increasing sales, thereby demonstrating improved sales efficiency.

In addition, the Lottery's annual business processes and long-range strategic planning remain consistent with other United States' lotteries. The annual business plan serves as a measure for comparison of actual performance to projections. Also, as the Lottery was successful in increasing total sales, it similarly increased its contribution to education for the years ended June 30, 2000, 1999, and 1998.

Overall, our analysis of the report suggests that the Lottery's financial management is sound and responsible, and that its actions have been responsive to the Bureau's audit. Moreover, as shown in its annual audited financial statements, the Lottery has fully complied with the legal requirement to provide 34 percent of revenues, plus interest income and unclaimed prizes, to public education.



How Each Lottery Dollar Is Spent



**Actual allocation of revenue for fiscal year 1999-2000.*

Since its start-up in 1985, the California Lottery® has contributed \$12 billion to public education. Total Lottery sales have exceeded \$32 billion and more than \$16 billion has been distributed to winners as prize money.

In the 1999-2000 fiscal year, the California Lottery® contributed \$948 million to public schools. This represented approximately two percent of the state's total education budget, including local, state and federal funding.

According to the Lottery Act of 1984, it was the intent of the voters that the net revenues of the Lottery would be used to supplement the total amount of money allocated for public education. Proposition 98, approved by the voters in 1988, constitutionally guarantees a percentage of total General Fund revenues for public schools. Lottery funds are in addition to General Fund revenues.

The Lottery contribution is distributed quarterly to each K-12 school district and to the governing bodies of public colleges and universities. The money is distributed based on enrollment, in equal amounts per student.

The Lottery plays no role in deciding how schools use their Lottery money. Only locally elected school boards and the governing bodies of colleges and universities are allowed to make decisions on how Lottery contributions are spent. However, Proposition 20, approved by voters in March of 2000, requires that school and community college districts utilize 50% of any allocation above their 1997/98 revenue from the Lottery for instructional materials only. The Lottery Act states that schools may not use Lottery funds for property acquisition, facility construction, or to fund research.
